**Notes from the Treasurer**

The final result for the 2009-2010 Financial Year was a deficit of \$1976.60, which compares with a surplus of \$2997.39 in 2008-2009.

These two results are directly related, and are because for the function we held at Tilley's on 27 June 2009, all takings were banked in 2008-2009, but all expenditure took place in 2009-2010. So the average for each of the two years was a surplus of about \$500.

**The CJC Committee has a policy of not allowing our bank balance to increase above current levels, and instead providing additional benefits to Members.**

**Examples were the free BBQ at the Christmas Party last year (which will be repeated this year), subsidised bus fares to functions such as Robertson, and subsidised entry fees to CJC functions.**

We have also made savings in the cost of printing and posting the newsletter, and in the lower cost of our Public Liability Insurance. These savings will also be passed back to Members.

The original copy of the Annual Report has been certified as correct by the Auditor.
